Executive Summary

Overall 2007 remained a year of optimism for Afghanistan as the prospect of genuine peace and prosperity were nourished. As the NATO forces took the charge of Afghanistan's security with the collaboration of Afghan forces, and the possible extension of the peace and security forces to areas out side the center. Even though violence flared up intermittently in some areas of Afghanistan. Overall, the security situation has been improving, especially in our focus area the central Afghanistan there is no security risk at all. The enthusiasm of the local communities and their willing participation in implementation of projects especially those concerning women /girls have been exceptionally encouraging and reinvigoration for the organization at least this is indicative of genuine desire for peace, democracy and development.

Once again, the urgency and need for tangible development could not under state. With increasing levels of poverty and no support mechanism, huge tracts of land have been consigned to opium-poppy cultivation. As the government has banned the poppy cultivation and the poor farmers have not been compensated by the government yet.

As this report will bear out, the organization continues to believe that the rehabilitation of the society can only be achieved by integrating and accentuating the role of civil society especially women in the reconstruction process. To achieve this end, we have implemented several projects among which are pioneering women rights awareness and literacy courses for women.

The emergent challenge for the Shuhada Organization now is to adapt a new framework for operating in tandem with the society and government as well. The approach so far, has been to delegate the management and operation of projects, such as schools, hospitals/clinics, and women rights awareness, trainings/capacity building and livelihood to the agencies of Afghan Government wherever possible.

While the organization seeks and establish new projects in remote areas especially the Central Afghanistan. Where the government cannot maintain a presence because of aloof from the centre. In so doing, we hope to establish an extensive groundwork for the country's infrastructure.

As always, we are thankful to the donors for their generosity, and will urge them to continue their valuable support. Moreover, we also request their diligence and continuous emphasis towards the resolution of problems that face Afghan women.

Finally, the organization also thanks the communities for their continual confidence in our activities and their enthusiasm and courage to change the future for their children.

Shuhada Organization:

The Shuhada Organization is a non-profit, non-political, and non-governmental organization dedicated to the welfare and progress of Afghan people residing inside and outside of Afghanistan, with a primary focus on the empowerment of women and girls. The Shuhada Organization operates programs in the areas of health, education, income generation, construction, training, and relief distribution. Founded and directed by Dr. Sima Samar in 1989. The Shuhada Organization is the oldest Afghan NGO working in Afghanistan and Pakistan, and the largest Afghan woman-led non-governmental organization.

The civil war which lasted more than two decades in Afghanistan the scar of that proxy war can still be seen which paralyzed every aspect of life and mostly had bad impact on women mentally and physically. Under the Taliban's rule, women and girls were deprived of their most basic human rights. The Taliban prohibited women's education, employment, and mobility and severely limited their access to health care. Women were beaten, shot at, tortured, and even killed for disobeying Taliban decrees. While women are slowly regaining their rights today in Afghanistan, the opposition of fundamentalist forces to women's rights remains strong. Yet, in this dire context, the Shuhada Organization, under the leadership of Dr. Sima Samar, has courageously and successfully provided education, health care, and income generation opportunities for women. As the war continued in the country and the political parties were busy fighting each other and no one paid much attention on health care and education especially for women and girls in Afghanistan. But Shuhada Organization was able to provide health care especially reproductive health care to the women.

The Shuhada Organization, with its first hospital, was established in Quetta, Pakistan in 1989. The hospital was established to address the total absence of reproductive health care for Afghan women refugees living in Pakistan. Over 4 million refugees fled Afghanistan during the Soviet Invasion and subsequent civil war. Virtually no health care was available to refugee women, who lived in cities or in refugee camps. In the urban areas, every political party had a hospital for its male members, but the hospitals did not provide health care for even the families of the party members. Fundamentalists who opposed women's rights and women's health care dominated the refugee camps, threatening the security of female staff and preventing the delivery of reproductive health services. Moreover, the international community showed little interest in supporting women's health care.

In order to provide desperately needed health care for refugee women, Dr. Samar established the Shuhada Clinic to provide a full range of reproductive health care services. Realizing that another major barrier to women's health care was the lack of education among women, the Shuhada Organization soon opened a school for girls and an adult literacy program for women. From these beginnings, the Shuhada Organization has established a network of 4 hospitals, 12 clinics, 60 schools, two women's shelters, a multi-service women's centre, a science institute, orphanage, and different programs to provide income, training, health education, and basic literacy for women. Currently, over 49,700 girls and boys study in Shuhada schools. The clinics and hospitals now provide services to some 750 patients a day. With over 1000 staff,

Some about Shuhada's Projects

Shuhada's projects are located in some of the most isolated, deprived, exploited and persecuted areas of community in of Afghanistan, which had no health facilities or schools before the organization began its work. The majorities of the Shuhada Organization's programs operate in the most remote and isolated central region of Afghanistan. These areas are home to the Hazara ethnic majority, which has been the victim of severe discrimination throughout Afghanistan's history and of ethnic cleansing under the Taliban. The Shuhada Organization also runs programs in West Kabul, the poorest section of the city which suffered the most destruction during the civil wars in the 1990s. In addition to being essentially the only provider of services to the Hazara community, the Shuhada Organization runs programs for the poor of all ethnic groups all over Afghanistan.

Afghanistan has one of the highest rates of maternal mortality in the world, with 50/1000 women dying every day from complications related to pregnancy. Women in Afghanistan have had virtually no access to family planning and emergency and gynecological health care facilities.

Shuhada hospitals are located in Jaghori, Behsood, and Yakawlang in Afghanistan. Shuhada hospitals include OPD and IPD capabilities, delivery rooms, operating theatres, diagnostic laboratories, x-ray, vaccination facilities and Vaccination program for Mothers and children Shuhada's hospitals in Jaghori, which was established in 1993, also provide a venue of the training of nurses, and health workers who are then deployed to work in other facilities within the Shuhada network and with other NGO's.

One of the greatest challenges to providing health care in Afghanistan has been the lack of trained staff. Over the course of 23 years of war, Afghanistan lost most of its educated people. During the Soviet Invasion, doctors and other intellectuals were abducted and assassinated. To escape persecution and save their lives, other doctors, nurses, and health care professionals fled the country. To remedy this acute shortage of health care providers, the Shuhada Organization initiated a variety of programs in order to trained staff and to provide basic health services to the greatest number of women throughout the central region of Afghanistan.

To promote safe delivery, the Shuhada Organization has held training programs for nurse, traditional birth attendants and community health workers in rural Afghanistan. These health care workers provide information on pre-natal care, family planning and sexually transmitted diseases and are trained to assist in deliveries and to identify warning signs of complications in pregnancy. Because the ability of women to travel without a male relative is restricted in Afghanistan, the Shuhada Organization created a unique program to train teams of brothers and sisters or husbands and wives as community health care workers and nurses who would be free to travel and provide services in any location. The Shuhada Organization runs nurse training programs. These nurses, in turn, staff Shuhada health care facilities and help run trainings for traditional birth attendants, community health care workers, and reproductive health education.

Because of the destruction of war and Taliban restrictions on teaching science, few post-secondary education programs were open to men in Afghanistan and none were open to women. In 1999, the Shuhada Organization opened a co-ed post-secondary Science Institute in Quetta, Pakistan. The purpose of this first-of-its-kind Science Institute is to train young women and men as physician assistants, emergency medical technicians,

and science teachers. Following graduation from this 3-year program, these young women and men did return to Afghanistan to help with the provision of health care and the reconstruction of their country.

In 2001, the Shuhada Organization launched a new reproductive health education and literacy program for poor women in Kabul. Supervised by female doctors with classes run by female nurses, the program provides 3-month courses in literacy training and reproductive health education. At the conclusion of the course, the trainees are provided with materials to instruct women in their villages about reproductive health, spacing of children, contraception and sexually transmitted diseases and with contraceptives. For most of these women, the courses are the first education that they have received and their first exposure to family planning information. Women who take the course and those whom they instruct afterwards learn about pre-natal care, when to seek treatment for pregnancy or delivery complications, and that smaller families result in better health for themselves and their children, better economic conditions for their families, and more chances for their children to be educated. The program has widespread community support and waiting lists of women who want to participate. The program is now being replicated in the Bamiyan region of Afghanistan. The Shuhada Organization also opened a reproductive health center at the Bamiyan Women's Center, which will be staffed by a nurse and provide reproductive health services, information, and referrals.

In Afghanistan today, many obstacles to the provision of health care to women remain. With the fall of the Taliban, women can now seek medical care without government restrictions the Shuhada Organization continues to be one of the organizations's devoted to making reproductive health care available to poor women.

The schools have dramatically improved both female and male levels of education in remote parts of Afghanistan. As a result, in the elections for delegates for the June 2002 Loya Jirga, the areas in which Shuhada operates its schools and hospitals had the highest participation of women as both candidates and voters. Through its schools and training programs, the organization generates its own future staff. Many students in Shuhada schools and other education programs are working in the organization's projects or involved in other ways in Afghanistan's rehabilitation and reconstruction.

Shuhada's education and health care programs work in tandem. Through Shuhada health care facilities, women not only gain access to health services but they are also exposed to educational and training opportunities. Students and staff in Shuhada's education programs receive information on reproductive health care and women's rights as a part of their curriculum. The organization provides training, income generation, and employment opportunities for both educated and uneducated women. All Shuhada income generation programs have a literacy component that includes reproductive health care and women's rights education.

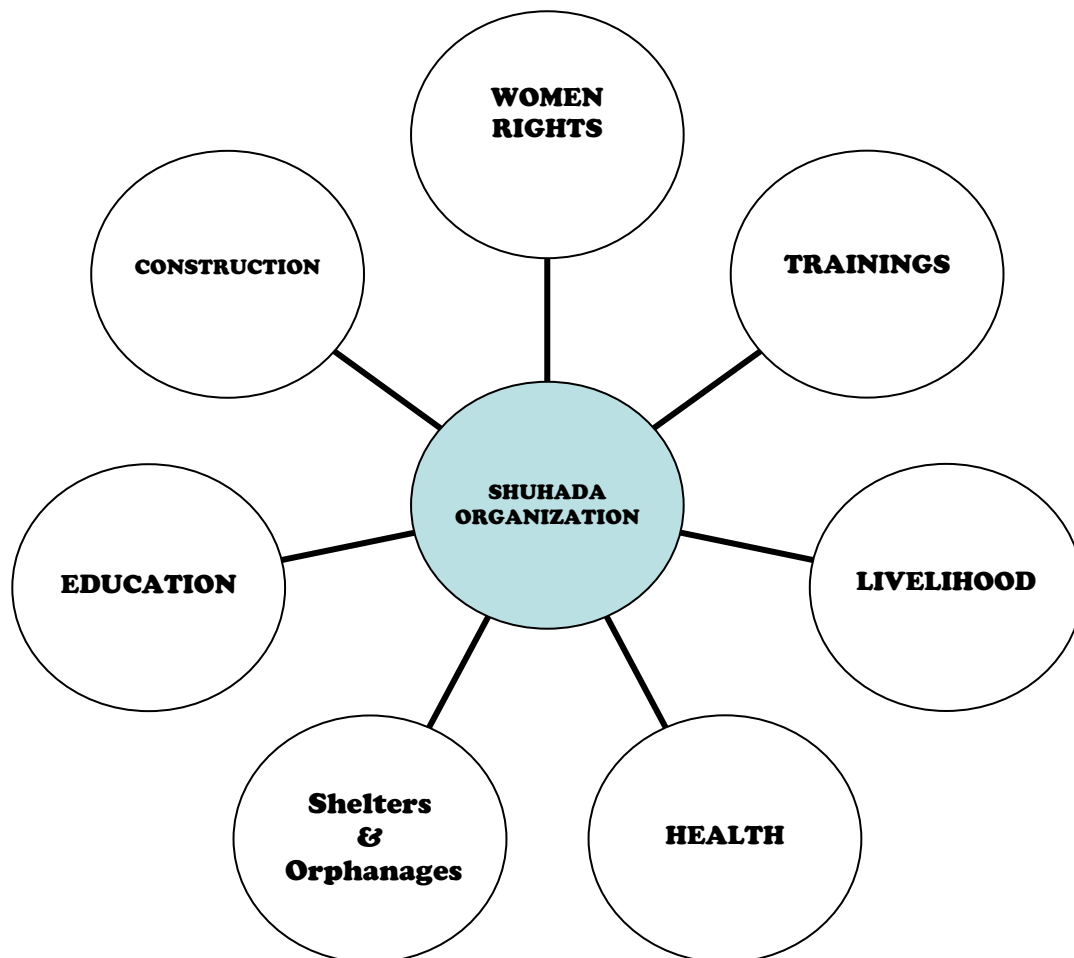
By providing education to the boys and girls in the districts of Central part of the country, those districts have shown more students admitted in the Kabul University comparing to the other parts of the country.

For the provision of education to male/female students the Shuhada organization has established more than seventy (70) schools in central Afghanistan, now most of them have been handed over to the ministry of education government of Afghanistan only 25 are remaining with Shuhada Organization, due to unavailability of funds for running cost. Besides this the organization also provides trainings in capacity building, professional and technical skills. Teacher training and human rights in capacity

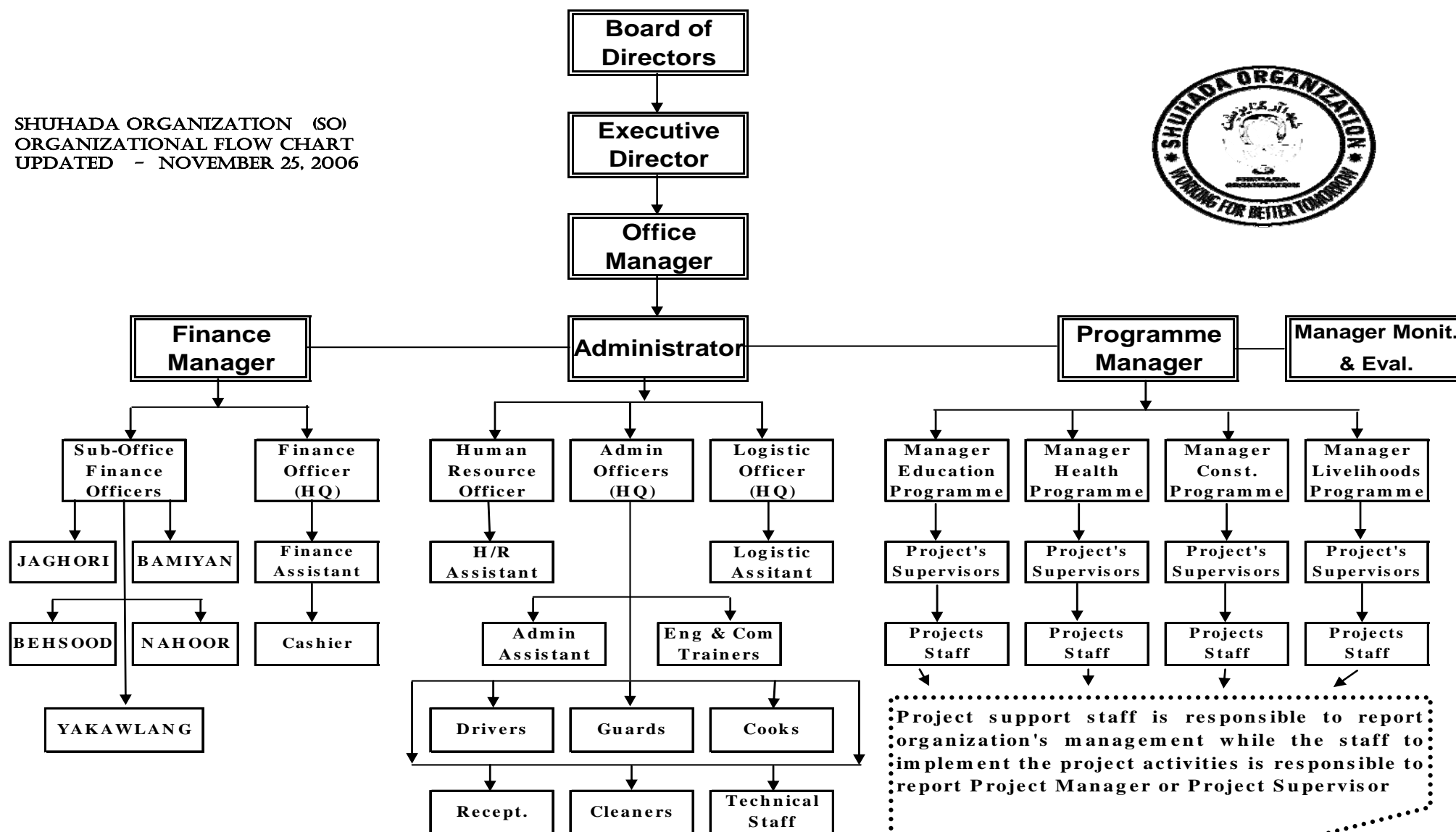
building while in technical trainings solar technology, metal work, hardware and woolen products etc.

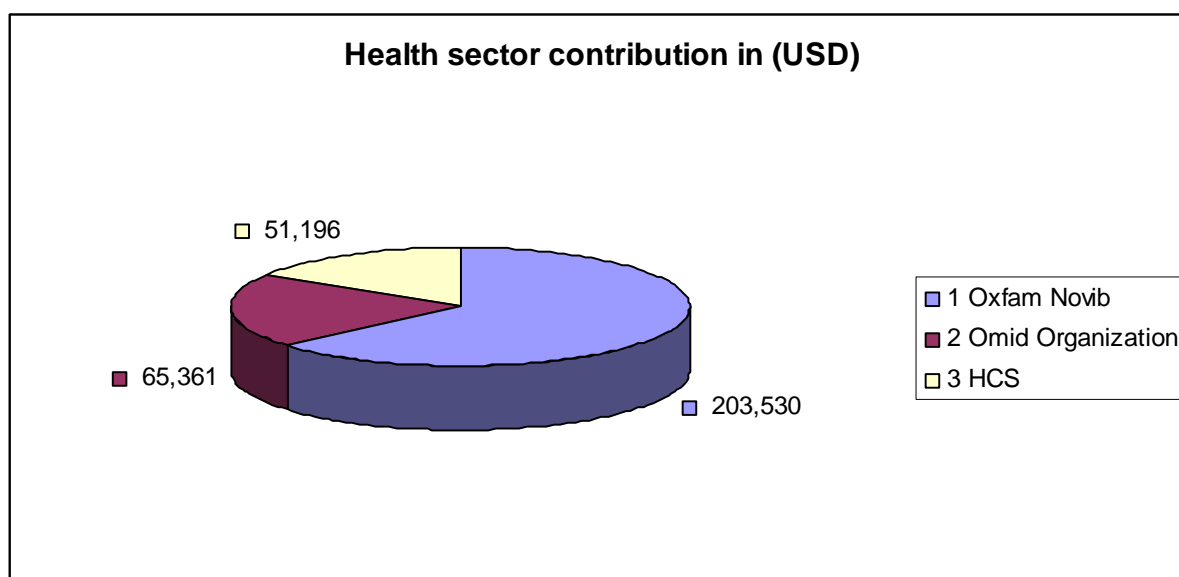
Currently, Shuhada Organization manages three hospitals along with six health clinics in Central Afghanistan.

The region, the people of the area were fallen in superstition, seems to be unconfident, reluctant to take part in development activities and also having lack of knowledge about health, health education, hygiene promotion etc. But currently, they seem to be confident as compare to past few years. They are aware about health care and now they soon realize and understand the disease and consult it with the doctors. This is made possible by



continuous efforts of Shuhada staff, because they motivate them towards health care by the teaching health education. Health committees in most of villages are active, especially in the areas where Shuhada hospitals and clinics are in function. The health education is taught by our health surveyors in the hospitals while at clinics, through nurses. In health education we taught about Community health, reproductive health, TBA training, awareness about HIV AIDS and nurse training, and also about HBS/HCS. All such activities have been carried out in health sector throughout the year 2007.



SHUHADA HOSPITAL JAGHORI:

The Shuhada Hospital, Jaghori remained active throughout the year (2007). All sections of Hospital working normally under the supervision of Hospital Incharge. Shuhada Hospital along with 50 bed IPD, remained fully in operations, capacity like OPD, IPD, OT, Labor Room, X-Rays, Labs, Dressing, Ultrasound, Vaccination, Nurse Training, Health Education. The health includes HIV AIDS, family planning, reproductive health; TBAs etc. were the main activities during the year.



Other Activities

Jaghori Hospital:

- ✓ Construction of an incinerator for cleanliness purposes.
- ✓ Construction of a bathroom for staff.
- ✓ Establishment of local council and health committee.
- ✓ Improvement have made in Administration and Finance departments according to revised policies and Procedures of SO.



SHUHADA HOSPITAL BEHSOOD:

Shuhada Hospital in Behsood remained active with its OPD, 20 bed IPD, X-ray, diagnostic laboratory, delivery and operation rooms, and vaccination section in 2006. The main activities regarding to the Community was remained positive. Shuhada Hospital Behsood also providing health education and awareness programs to the local community.

Health Education:

Health Education is provided at community level through our mobile teams and also in the hospital to all patients, especially women.

The Education based on community health awareness, HIV AIDS awareness, and family planning.

Shuhada Clinic (Khawat)

The Shuhada Clinic in Khawat, Nahoor continued its curative activities during 2006 with a doctor, a female and a male nurse, and a laboratory technician. The clinic dispenses basic curative services, and the complicated cases are referred to any of the Shuhada Hospitals in Behsood or Jaghori. The clinic was also a base for training local traditional birth assistants and vaccination. The clinic also provides TBA services to the local community.

Shuhada Clinic (Sarab)

This clinic also provides curative and preventive health services to the poor people. The clinic is staffed with a doctor, three female and a male nurse. Besides providing curative services, the clinic also provides TBA and vaccination services. Sarab clinic provide health education through female nurses.

Shuhada Clinics (Lal and Sar-e-Jangal)

Shuhada Clinics related to the Lal and Sar-e-Jangal remained active through 2007 maintained by a pair of male and female nurses and two guards along with a supervisor doctor. Lal and Sar-e-Jangal is remote area of Ghor Province and it has very important job over there. The isolation of the area as well as our inability to offer high salaries coupled with the fact that the area does not have any local doctors' lead to our inability to hire doctors who were willing to remain as residents in these clinics.

Shuhada Clinics (Topchi & Karte-Sulh, Bamyan)

Shuhada Clinic Bamayn, remained active during the year for betterment of the local people. Shuhada Clinic was activated to provide basic curative health services for local community. During the year the activities of this clinic were helpful for people regarding to hygiene promotion.

All clinics remain active during the year 2007 in their areas with the help of above mentioned donors. All activities during the year are given at the end of this session, in a brief chart, which shows the exact number of patients in year 2006. All medicine provided by the Shuhada Clinics is free of cost.

A Brief about Shuhada Activities in Health Sector

1: Normal Construction in Health Sectors.

In 2007, Every Health center has employed the responsible person for Protection & supervision as well as in Jaghori Hospital one incinerator constructed in order to remove dirtiness of hospital's environment, In sarab clinic one newly kitchen Constructed, the Canalization System of Shuhada Hospital reconstructed & Healthy Water Irrigation System Constructed Additionally.

2: Equipments' Section.

In 2006, every center has been specified, the equipments list that registered in different section exist, each room has its own specified list which contain useful health related Information.

3: Medicines & Basic Materials' Section.

In 2007, the drug purchase is based on purchase requisition forms according to Shuhada Organization's policies & supervision of drug consumption is carried out by system of consumption cards.

4: Employment Section.

In 2007 Recruitment policies, promotion, Appreciation, Retribution, Awards & at last neglects are arranged & Implemented.

5: Training Section.

The annual training plan for 2007 in different health center was arranged & implemented. All of workshops which were held by ministry of public health we had our own participants as well as according to the plan, doctors were introduced & dispatched to several opacity hospital while the personnel's of shuhada's clinics has been trained according to the plans.

6: Social accessibility.

The coverage regions of health centers were determined in 2007 & the IEC's activities in health centers were carried out according to the plans & several methods were used.

7: Assistance to Society.

Directors of health centers had a series of meetings to discuss, evaluate their works & submitted their working plans.

8: Evaluation of working quality.

In previous years the evaluation was carried out by directors of health centers along with evaluation board from main office, than the final report was submitted to main office.

In year 2007, the evaluation system (monitoring Policies) introduced & arranged, According to monitoring policies, all of Shuhada Organization health sector was

monitored, on the basis of this evaluation process, head office distributes the Retribution & Awards among the Sectors and departments for there best activities in the region.

In workshop of February 2007 the succeeding & competent sectors & personals received awards & prizes in this regards as well.

With the above developments within Shuhada Health Sector bring changes to the daily life of common people which we seemed in current year.

- Dew to new Construction of the incubator room in Shuhada Hospital in Yakawlang at least three people in year 2006 and much more in 2007 were survived.
- Formation of Ultra Sound section in Shuhada' Hospitals increased the effectiveness of Treatments & Diagnosis. Now, Treatment is available for those patients who referred to main Hospitals at Kabul before.
- Establishment of Local Council not only ready the identification of complicated local Difficulties & Problems but they also be informed of Health planning & Problems facing by health sector and Propose the best Solution for the facing problems as well as Cooperate in order to planning implementation.
- In fact introduction of CHWs is Access & Assistance to society, especially about pregnant Women; they are capable to encourage the women to refer in Clinics & Hospitals in order to Complete Vaccination & Delivery of their child in Health Centers.
- Formation of TB sections Provide facilities for local people, especially who are suffering from Tuber Clauses, They don't need to go long distances by foot, now they can get treatment & medicines from nearest Medical Centers.

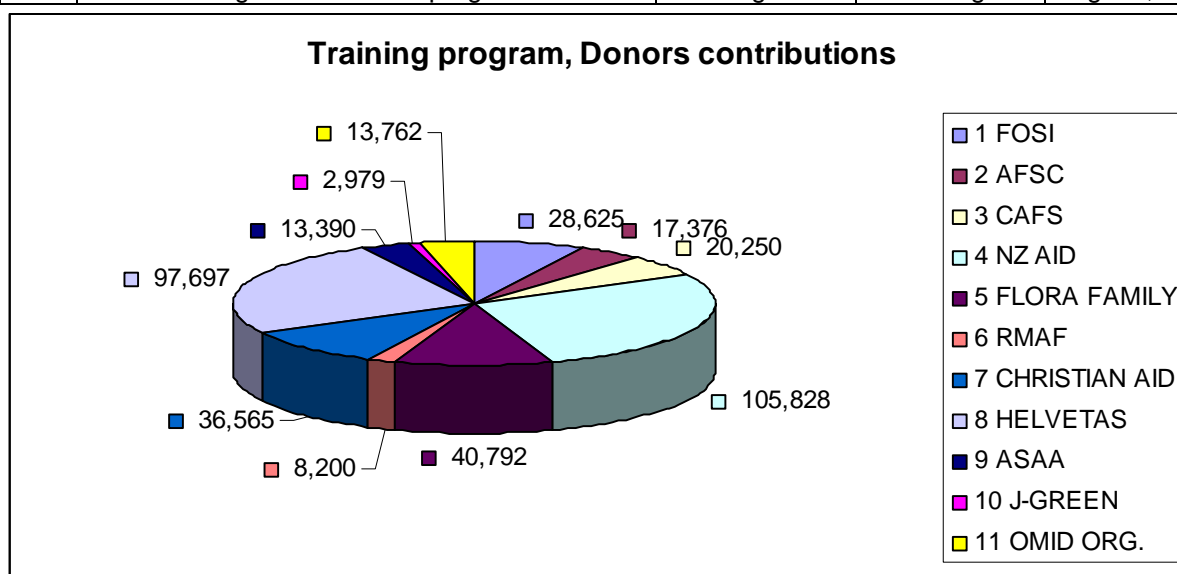

TEACHER TRAINING COURSE

Accomplished objectives and impact:

The Shuhada Organization has planned TTP in three months winter vacation in the country in order to promote the educational standard in the region and also to save the time of the teachers. This program was started in Bamyan, Yakawlong and Jaghuri (Ghazni) by the kind financial supports of Helvetas, AFSC and ACFS on the following procedure. Jaghuri and surrounding areas 775 male and female teachers by Helvetas, AFSC 30 teachers in Bamyan and 30 in Yakawlong while 100 teachers have been trained by the support of Marco Niada in Bamyan.

First of all we have appointed the project staff for three months the supervisors, trainers, and guards and hiring of space (centers). For the proper commencement of the course we have contacted with the districts education offices of Jaghuri, Yakawlong and main Bamyan for the selection of trainees.

According to our plan we have selected 935 trainees for the course in the following manner.

Yakawlong 30, Main Bamyan 130 and 775 in Jaghuri. All these trainees have been



registered at their offices and divided into groups each group of 25, so, total 37 groups were made in 09 centers.

Impact of Teacher Training

Education plays an important role in the development of a nation/country. As Shuhada Organization has stated in its mission that the Shuhada Organization is dedicated to the welfare of Afghan people with a special focus on the empowerment of women and girls.



Keeping in view, the abovementioned fact and mission, the Shuhada Organization has spread an educational network all over the central Afghanistan for the education of boys and girls, since, establishment; the Shuhada Organization has been able to established more than seventy (70) schools in central Afghanistan for boys and girls. Currently more than one lakh girls and boys are studying in these schools. In addition to this, million of people are being benefited economically as well as morally from these schools.

We see a tremendous change in the lives as well as in thoughts of the people; the people of the region are demanding more schools and projects relating to capacity building in the area. Now the people of the area have been recognized the importance of education and prefer to send their children



to schools instead of work. Moreover, in 2005, parliamentary election the women vote polling ratio has also been greater as compare to other parts of the country. Mean while, the literacy rate has also been enhanced in these areas almost up to 25%. Over all education level is improving day by day, the number of students especially is being increasing in the schools. The number of students has risen in concor (University Entry Test) exam during the reporting year almost 5000 students were appeared in concor exam from all over Central Afghanistan and passing ratio remained almost 65%. Those are sent to different universities in Afghanistan for higher education for various faculties.

In general, the economic condition as well as the standard of living is being improving in the region. A sense of modern society has been developing in the region; employment ratio is also improving by means of teacher training, English and Computer training, TBA and nurse training. All these situations lead to peace and security in region, because the people have established various committees like, health, education and construction etc. at the village base. These committees are working voluntarily in the area. It has meeting on regular bases and also have meetings with the NGOs and government ministries and departments and discuss their problems and issues with them. This is the result of Shuhada Organization's educational net working in the region.

Consequently, if the teachers will train they can better guide their pupils and proved to be very helpful in the building of a healthy society.



VOCATIONAL TRAININGS

Shuhada Organization currently providing Vocational Training in the area of Metal work, Solar Technology and Carpet weaving in Gazni and Bamyan Provinces.

INFORMATION ON CONTEX:

Central Afghanistan have been one of the neglected areas of Afghanistan. This area has been suffering from aridity since last several years. People are greatly dependent upon the harvesting yields. Due to drought, the people could not get proper



and enough harvest from their lands for the last several years. Therefore, drought, poverty, lack of job opportunities and limited resources available, has made the people life miserable. The people of this region are not in a position to survive without external support or the extension of job

opportunities, and they are migrating to the neighboring countries due to the continuous aridity and economic problem. The social services in Jaghori and Bamyan are poorly equipped both in terms of administration and equipment. The district of Jaghori and Bamyan has been identified as a Vocational Training projects area not because of the need to reconstruct what was destroyed by the war, but the region has been deprived by development programs and neglected in the past.

Moreover, here in Afghanistan the private sector is affected by seasons. In the winter due to intense cold and snow construction work is suspended. In spring the weather is pleasant, the private and public works are started, the people are searching jobs and hope to earn something for their families. Although some are benefiting from casual labor, costs of living have gone up



as well drastically. Therefore, they prefer send their children for work instead of schools to earn some things for their families.



In year 2007, Vocational Center at Jaghori the beneficiaries are selected 10 boys for solar technology, 10 for metal work and 20 girls and boys for English and computer course and 08 female for carpet weaving in Bamyar Women Center, the poorest are given preference. Besides vocational & professional trainings the Shuhada

Organization has also arranged literacy class for solar and metal work trainees who are still illiterate.

Moreover, Overall financial situation of the beneficiaries is improving on one hand while on the other hand the most important thing is noted in year 2007, that is social and environmental change, because the people of Central Afghanistan are being motivated by the Shuhada Organization's staff towards their basic rights and other skill development and capacity building programs etc. now they prefer to send their children to go to schools instead of forcing to work.

Due to illiteracy they couldn't find suitable jobs but are very keen for the future of their children. As they gradually, improving their financial situation but still they are in need to be supported financially. And also with technical support as well.

As they all consider Shuhada as stepping stone towards more technical education and for betterment of their lives and children. Besides the survey the Shuhada holds meeting with the parents and always discusses its plans, policies and strategies with the parents. Like

- a) Education for working children in Afghanistan.
- b) Vocational training for youths of Afghanistan.
- c) Job orientation courses for youth (accounting, management, English and computer etc)
- d) Small business and micro credit program for Afghan poor families.
- e) Establishment of more schools



and colleges in Afghanistan.

- f) Skill development program for poor young people of Afghanistan.

- g) Civil society development among the masses,

especially in women through home based education, women rights awareness program and handicraft trainings.



2. OBJECTIVE :

- a) Skill development and capacity building through Vocational and skill development trainings like Metal works, Solar system training and English and computer courses.



In order to help them with education and vocational trainings of their children the Shuhada initiated to support these people by involving their children in the projects. In year 2007, 60 girls/boys are attending English and computer courses, 10 boys for hardware and metal works and 10 boys are selected for solar system training.

And on other hand in Bamyan, Shuhada Organization has organized Carpet weaving and literacy project in Top Chi village, Bamyan. The carpet weaving program was started in January 2007, with the kind support of SOPRA in women centre at Bamyan. 8 women and young girls were selected for the period of one year. At the time of beneficiaries' selection women headed houses are given preference. All the necessary arrangements have been made like, hall, class room, staff and equipments and materials etc. Class timing 8:00 to 4:00pm daily six days in week including literacy

class. The course contents are comprises of introduction, measuring, cutting and practical etc.

For first two months introduction about carpet weaving equipment and materials, measuring and installation of looms have been taught and then practical work on looms started. Besides, the necessary equipments and materials one USD daily has also been paid as stipend to all trainees for their survival.

Now the course has completed all the trainees are in a position to work independently, but keeping in view the economic condition of the beneficiaries presently they are weak economically, the Shuhada organization is seeking some ways to arrange some small business for them. And also provide some assistance in marketing.



Shuhada Organization working Besides the training they will be provided with literacy class as well. Moreover, the Shuhada Organization is seeking some ways to support these trainees with finance and equipments to start their own businesses. Or provide micro financing for them to start their own works.

IMPACT OF VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Carpet Weaving

After one year training, the trainees are in a position to work independently. Now almost all the students are working some where in Bamyan part time. They learnt how to measure or design carpet, on one side they learnt carpet weaving while on the other hand they learnt writing and reading.



All the trainees are practicing on regular basis in Top chi and in Bamyan city on daily wage basis and earning daily an amount of 50 to 100 Afghanis.

Their economical situations are improving day by day and are vary happy with their performances. This is the great indicator towards peace and prosperity of Afghanistan.

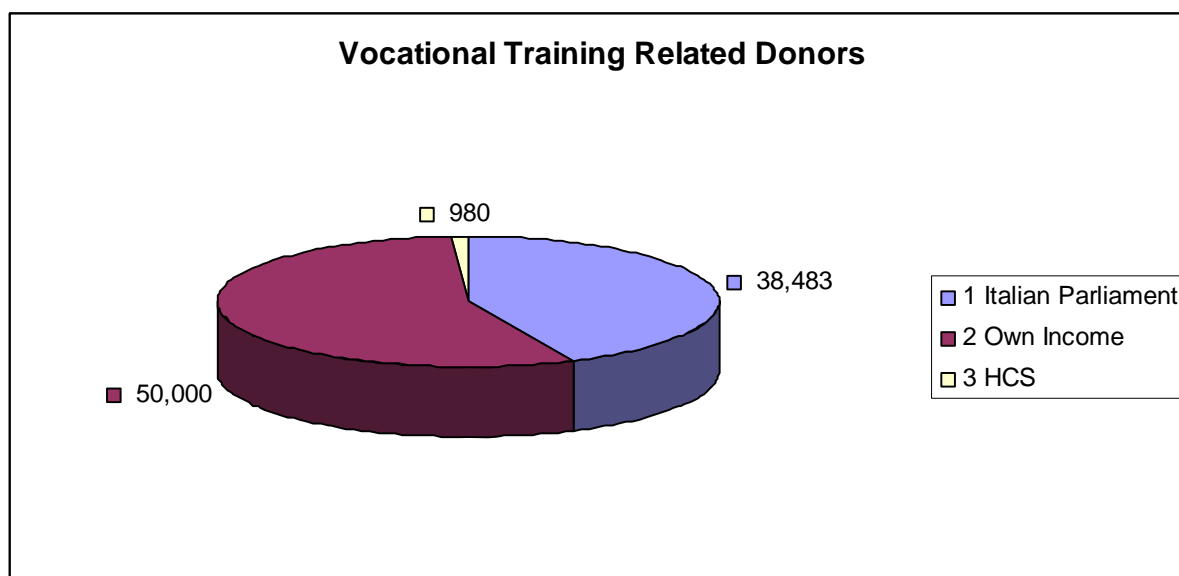
Moreover, the Shuhada organization intends to provide small business facilities for these trainees to set up their own businesses.

In order to find out the hidden potential of the students the Shuhada organization has organized a plan of meetings with the students' representatives monthly to know their problems, ideas and potential towards the specific issue like how to improve the quality of education at Shuhada centre and appreciates their recommendations.

- Monthly meeting with students' representatives to discuss and hear their problems and seek their solutions in the presence of the students.
- Parents meetings on different issues.
- Parents committee etc.

The Shuhada organization always provides donations in the shape books and other academic aids to the students in every year as in 2007.



Afterward the time table changed into two shifts, morning shift and evening shift, the students was also grouped for practical work. In the morning shift they work in different sections of the hospital, i. e. OPD, IPD, X-rays, Laboratory, OT, Gynecology, labor room and emergency wards while in the evening shift they are taught the following subjects. Anatomy, physiology, pharmacology, basic gynecology and interior and child diseases. The Yakawlong course will end in February, 2007 while in Jaghuri and Behsood courses will be ended in June, 2007. At the end of the course all the trainees will be given certificates.

COMPUTER AND ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSES

In year 2006 there are fifty (60) students selected in Kabul, Jaghori, Bamyán for Computer and English Language Courses with 75% female students.

For our students who get English and Computer trainings for a year, opens up the way to further their education in a longer future perspective. Many expressed hope to become a teacher, doctor or scientist. This hope was not with them when they were not in our centre. It



It motivates them to work hard and improve their lives further. According to the students that now we have learnt little bit English and computer and we can do every thing which we want because this was the major obstacle in our academic career that was removed by the Shuhada with kind and sympathetic support of the donor. All the students are with aim that we will not leave it here but we will continue our practice to improve it more and more by reading more books, writing topics and teaching to our

younger brothers and sisters at home.



The people of Central Afghanistan especially the young generation is very keen to learn English and computer. Before the start of English and computer classes in projected areas, there



In the same manner, in computer their performance is also very well. They can operate and work on computer. They have passed all the tests and quizzes as well as the final

Examination regarding the computer at the end of course they will be awarded with certificates.

HUMAN RIGHTS AWARENESS COURSES:

Shuhada Organization' Education Sector not only works in Area of Education, Construction of schools, Teacher Training & Capacity Building but it is significantly Active in order to Introduce & Empower Democracy, Dissemination & Education of Human Rights, Women Rights, Reproductive Health System & Literacy of Women who are illiterate in Provinces of Bamiyan, Ghazni, Ghor, Dai Kundi, Maidan Wardak & Kabul.

In fact, the women in Afghanistan are still unaware about their rights. Their social life is miserable in this regard. A case study is given below for reference.

CASE STUDY:

we mention a woman named (F H) as a clear example who lives with her husband in Waras District of Bamian, she has lived with her husband about 15 years & worked with him in Agricultural Fields, When the economical Status of this family became better & this woman is suffering from illness due to hardship & Tiresome Works in agricultural fields, Instead of her Medical Treatment her husband married & pays no money on behalf of her Treatments.

Mrs. F Doesn't Complains against her husband due to this reason. She doesn't know about Legal rights of Women & Families therefore she thinks that men have the absolute rights & women don't have the basic rights even the rights of treatment.

Therefore Shuhada Organization since 2001 to date, in order to ensure Women rights & especially the rights of Rural women repeatedly Coordinated Workshops, Printed & Distributed Brochures & Books.

Shuhada Organization Formed the Legal Consultation & Guidance Units, the Human Rights Section of Shuhada Organization has many outstanding Activities which resulted in extraordinary participation of women in Presidential & Parliamentary Elections in Areas of Jaghori, Punjab & Waras.

The impact of these courses is given below.

- ✓ Reduction of forced Marriages
- ✓ Reduction of Family Violence
- ✓ Reduction of Misconduct against Women
- ✓ To activate women in Social & economical Activities

End of Hostility & Dispute which was existed between the inhabitants of two villages & victimized at least 74 people in Bamiyan Province, Shuhada Organization's Human Rights Section reconciled this Hostility in friendship & Peaceful Coexistence through Coordination & Arrangements of Human Rights & Women Rights Education for Women.

In year 2005 almost 1000 teachers were trained about the Human Rights Fundamentals & Reproductive Health System in Provinces of Maidan Wardag, Bamiyan, Dai Kondi & Ghazni and the Number 2491 Uneducated & Illiterate Women Benefited from literacy & Human Rights Education in Period of three months.

The Districts of Bamiyan, Maidan Wardag, Ghazni & Ghor Provinces about 20 women were provided the legal Consultation & Guidance, 120 courses were arranged & coordinated for women within the operated duration of three months, 32 workshops were held, 8800 learning books on human rights & 207800 Brochures & Awareness Sheets were printed & distributed.

In year 2007, about 2230 women trained in Human Rights & Women Rights Courses, 14 women were provided Legal Consultation & 2500 Learning books about Human Rights were Printed & Distributed among Women.

In year 2005, the Shuhada Organization has covered the Training 30429 Female Students & 20480 Male Students by 1169 Teacher & Administrative Personals in 72 Schools, & in 2006 after submitting of some schools to the ministry of education the Number of our School & Students also decreased to 8745 Female Students, 6816 Male Students, 402 Teachers & 25 Schools.

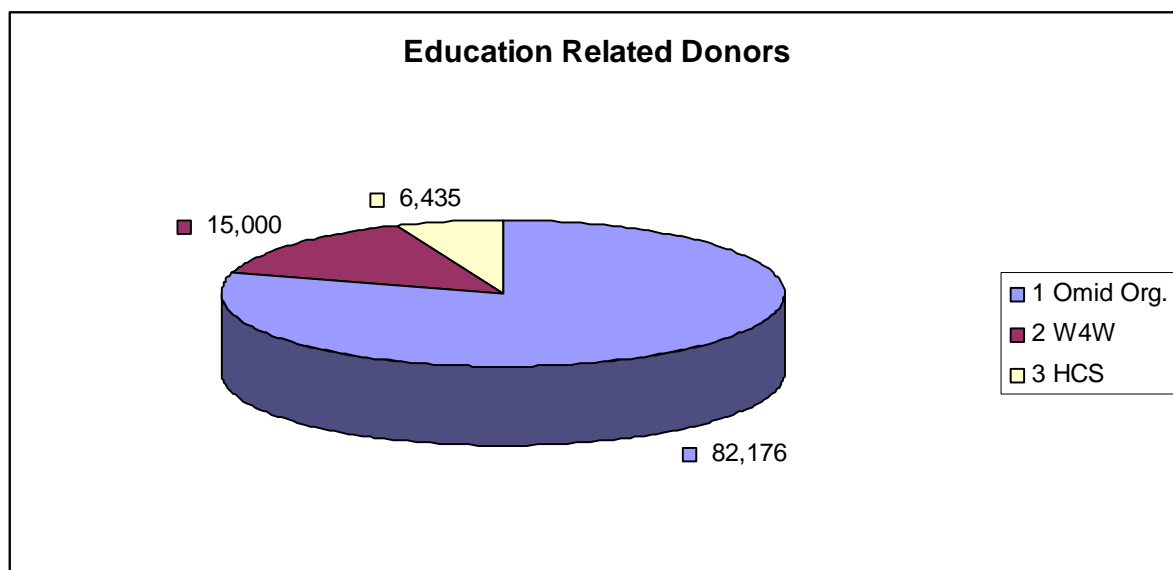
In year 2007, Shuhada Organization concentrated on Quality & Improvement of Education & Teacher Training & Capacity Building and Replaced the Quantity into Quality.

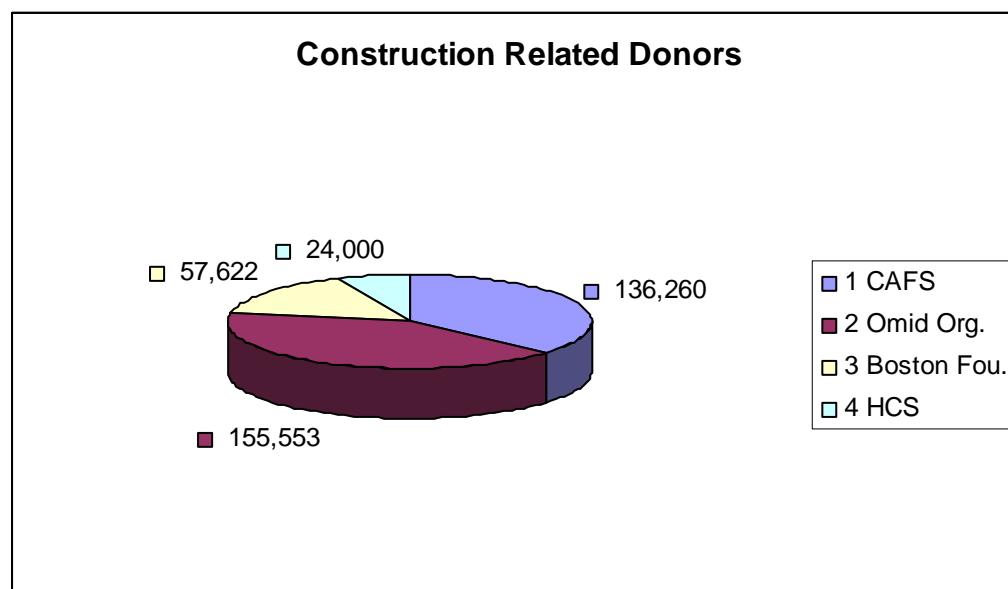

ORPHANAGE AND SHELTERS

The Shuhada Organization has established three Orphanages and a Shelter for those children whose parents have been died during the war and they have none for their look after

Shuhada Organization has three orphanages; two are in Jaghori (Ghazni), one for girls and other for boys, while the Bamyar Orphanage is for both girls and boys.



There are 59 children in Jaghori Orphanages, while in Karte Sulh Orphanage in Bamyar, there are 39 children.

All the facilities of life is provide in all orphanages like, play land, toys, kinder garden, sports etc. We have appointed mothers for the look after of these children and every mother is responsible to look after four to seven children. Besides this all the children are providing education in Shuhada Schools. We have also appointed a tutor in all orphanages the elder children, we have arranged

to teach the younger children, while for English and Computer classes, so that they could be aware with the modern means of communication. All the children are very keen and optimistic about their future, some have desired to be a doctor, engineers, scientist etc.

We have supervisors in all orphanages for the administration and management. The supervisors are assigned the responsible of the entire activities of the orphanage. All the activities of the orphanages are carried out according to 24 hours written schedule. The schedule includes food menu, school, tuition, plays and other related timings in this regard.



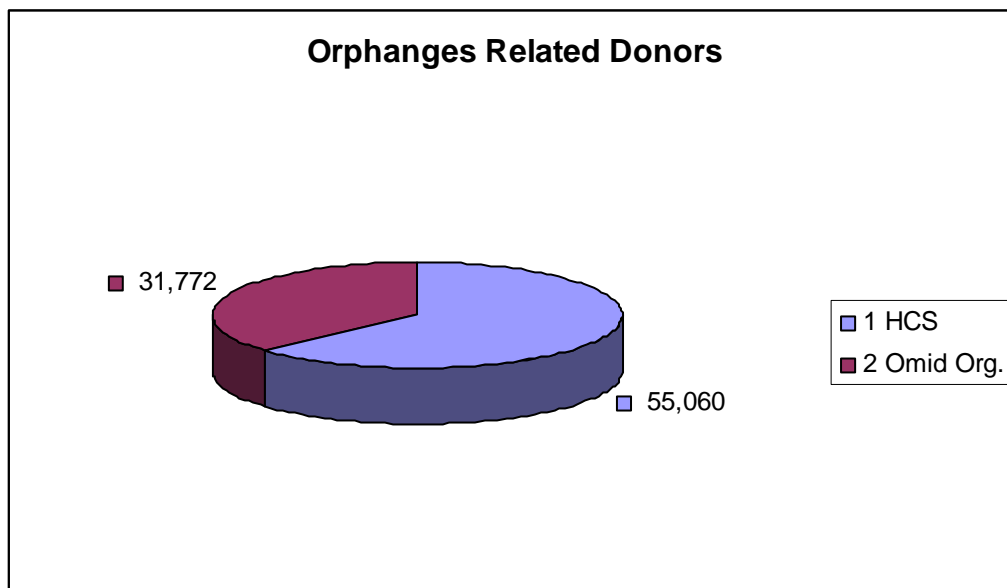


The supervisors are responsible to submit an activities report.

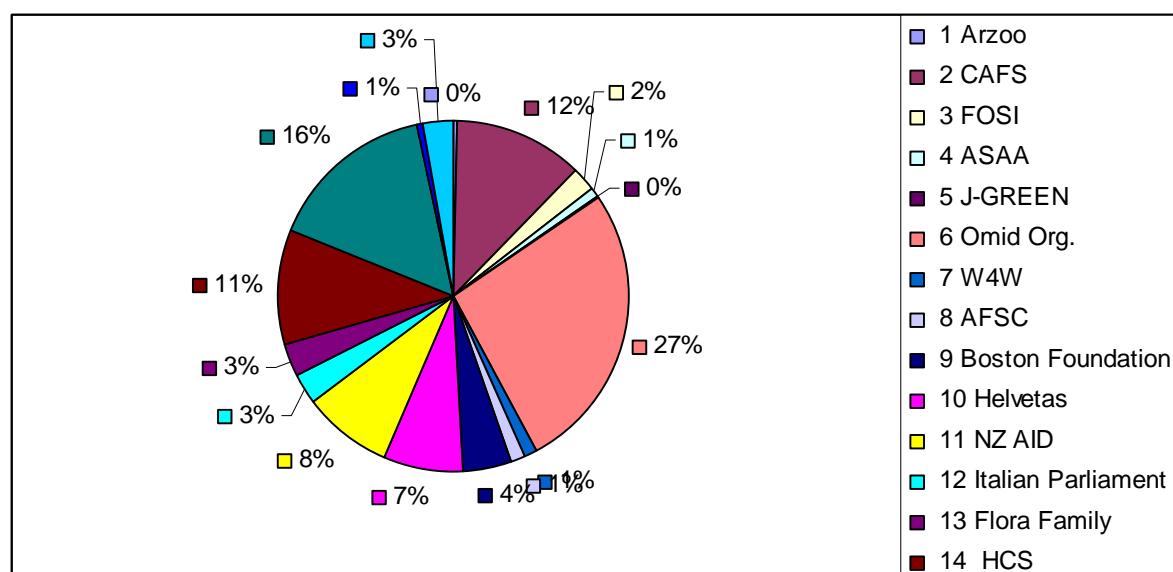
